Lesson title: What Bahá'ís believe about God. (Part 1)

Relevant syllabus area: Theology, Key Stage 1, "What do Bahá'ís believe about God?"

Learning objectives:

In this lesson the children will learn that:

- 1. Bahá'ís believe there is only one God.
- 2. Bahá'ís believe that all world religions come from the same God.

These ideas will be explored in several ways during the lesson.

- In a video,
- Through PowerPoint slides,
- And in activities.

Resources needed:

- The PowerPoint file and the audio/visual equipment necessary to present it.
- Access to the internet to play the video that is linked to in the PowerPoint Slide Show. The video is called "Introduction to the Bahá'í Faith"

Instructions:


- 1. The slide number is written on the top right of the screen.
- 2. Follow the corresponding narrative and directions for each slide. The narrative for the presenter is in quotes. Everything outside the quotes are directions for the presenter to follow.
